To build a Garden or not..... The cost of water!

The City will be offering a water meter that can be placed on your outside faucet to meter the water used for pools, gardens, or flowers. This meter will be your responsibility to maintain. Meters will be sold for \$100.00 beginning May 1. If you would like a meter, contact City Hall and we will deliver it you your house and hook it up for you and take the first reading. Monthly when the water dept. reads the your meter they will also read the irrigation meter.

The amount used will be deducted from your usage and you will not have to pay sewer charges on that amount.

Highlights of City Council Meeting

The City of Diamond is seeking Community Development Block Grant funds to help repair both cells of the lagoon. Both are leaking and must be repaired. Repair costs are estimated to be 1.1 million dollars. The City has hired Tri-State Engineering to do the preliminary engineering and file the construction permit. The City has also hired project Attorney William McCaffree to assist in acquiring funds to make the required repairs. As soon as funds have been secured construction will begin. Cell number one will be relined and cell number two will have repairs done to the berm. Thank you to all who participated in the survey. The survey information successfully allowed us to qualify to be eligible for the grant funds.

4. Be aware of flying objects, they cause most deaths and injuries.
5. Do not stay in mobile homes, even if they are tied down.
6. Do not seek shelter under a highway overpass.
